Virtue Ethics I Virtue ethics is an ethical view originating in ancient Greece which says that ethics is fundamentally about learning to live well I The basis of virtue ethics is the idea of eudaimonia, which means "the good life" or "life lived well" or "ourishing"

Virtue ethics is built around the concept of the ideal virtuous person We must ask ourselves how this person would behave and what virtues he or she would embody We then base our own character development on this ideal standard Again, the focus of virtue ethics is on becoming a virtuous person rather than on individual actions
